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15th ANNUAL LADY BAMFORD CENTER CHARITY GOLF TOURNAMENT

GOLF FORMAT: This tournament is conducted using a four-person team scramble format. Each team member tees off, and the best drive is selected. All four players then play from that spot. This process continues until the hole is completed, with only one score being recorded on the card for the team. Each team must use at least two (2) drives from each player during the course of the round.

*Bogey is max score per hole.

MOVEMENT OF BALL: The ball can be placed within one club length from the point of the ball chosen by the team captain. However, the ball must remain in the same type of lie and no closer to the hole. (for example, the ball remains in the rough or hazard) There will be no movement of the ball once the team is on the putting green.

TEE BOXES: Men ages 64 and under, will play from the "silver" tee boxes, and men ages 65+ and ladies will play from the "jade" tee boxes.

MULLIGANS: You are given the opportunity to purcase an All-in-one Ticket that gives you Two(2) Mulligans. These can be used anywhere on the golf course(Tee, fairway, green). Mulligans can not be used in any of the contests - Hole in One, 50/50 Closest to the pin, other closest to the pin, Long Drive holes, or Eagle Putt.

PRIZE MONEY: There will be two (2) divisions in this tournament, they are: The "net" division will pay \$400 for 1st place and \$200 for 2nd place. The "gross" division will pay \$400 for 1st place, and \$200 for 2nd place.

HANDICAPS: Each player must submit a USGA or GHIN handicap index. If no handicap index card is available, then the player must submit their average scores. The team handicap will be established by the handicap committee. Any ties will be broken using the USGA scorecard playoff system.

HOLE-IN-ONE CONTEST: There will be four (4) "hole-in-one" contests on each of the par 3's. The prizes that will be awarded for a "hole-in-one" will be as follows: (A.) Hole # 17 \$5,000 cash; (B.) Hole # 8 LED Smart Television (C.) Hole # 15 Set of Callaway Irons (D.) Hole # 3 Roundtrip Domestic Airfare for Two(2). A mulligan shot cannot be used to win any of the above prizes.

SPECIAL EVENT HOLES: There will be two (2) "Closest to the Pin" holes. The men's contest will be on **Hole # 3**, and the women's contest on **Hole # 15.** The ball must be on the green to qualify for this award. Also, there will be two (2) "Long Drive" holes. The men's contest will be on **Hole # 11**, while the women's contest will be on **Hole # 2**. The ball must be in the fairway to qualify for this award. The winners of these contests will receive \$50 in cash. A mulligan shot cannot be used to win any of the above contests. Also, multiple winners will not be allowed on these special event holes.

"50/50 - CLOSEST TO THE PIN: Each team member who holds a All-in-one Ticket can participate in the "closest to the pin" contest on **Hole # 8**. The winner will receive 50% of the proceeds of all monies collected on this special event. A mulligan shot cannot be used to win any of the above contest.

"EAGLE PUTT" HOLE: On Hole # 7, each team member can purchase a chance to putt for an eagle to improve his or her score on this hole. Mulligan can not be used.

"PUTTING CONTEST": A putting contest for \$5,000.00 will be held on the putting green during your play of golf. There will be a qualifying tournament to determine the person who will take their chance at a 60-foot putt to win \$5,000.00. Players who hold the All-in-one Ticket can participate, and can pay \$10 additional at a second chance.

THE LADY BAMFORD CENTER

FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT

Located in West Savannah at 1410 Richards St., The Lady Bamford Center was created through a joint partnership of JCB, the City of Savannah, and The United Way of the Coastal Empire.

The Center opened on October 15, 2007 and is operated by Wesley Community Centers of Savannah, Inc., a member of The United Way for nearly 50 years. The Wesley Community Center has a long and distinguished history of serving the needs of working mothers and minority families in the community. Wesley is under the direction of Tammy Mixon, who serves as executive director. The Lady Bamford Center currently accommodates 88 children, with children of homeless and low-income families, and those with physical, mental or emotional difficulties, receiving priority admission.

The Lady Bamford Center provides educational instruction and guidance in social skills to children from six weeks to four years of age. The center is not affiliated with the Savannah-Chatham Public School District. It operates independently and strives to prepare children for kindergarten and elementary school. The strong foundation they receive will allow them to compete academically with other children and increases their chances of succeeding in school and later on in life.

The interactive curriculum at The Lady Bamford Center for Early Childhood Development relies on stimulation, direction, spatial relations and color recognition to reach children at a critical stage in their development. Teachers who specialize in early childhood development provide basic instruction in good hygiene practices, appropriate table manners and other social graces. The Lady Bamford Center concentrates on four areas of childhood development: social, emotional, physical and cognitive. By employing a creative curriculum — one intended to encourage children to experience learning in a creative, stimulating setting — children will be enveloped in an environment that will nurture growth and development.
